


"Why us? Why Heriot-Watt University?" A confident and powerful voice shot through the silent lecture hall. A hand slowly raised up. That's it!

Turning Plastic Waste into Art: July 2024 Cohort



As part of foundation chemistry project, students are stepping up to make a difference by transforming plastic waste into artwork. This innovative project not only nurtures their creativity but also raises awareness about the pressing issue of plastic pollution. By collecting discarded plastics from their communities, students gain firsthand insight into the volume of waste produced daily and the impact it has on the environment.

The process begins with gathering plastic waste, which might include bottles, wrappers, and other discarded items. As they sort and clean the materials, students learn about recycling and the importance of reducing waste. Next, they brainstorm creative ways to repurpose these items, turning them into sculptures, murals, or mixed-media pieces that convey a powerful environmental message.


